ENROLLMENT OPTIONS

Full season enrollment is for a total of seven weeks and the camp program is designed for this time period. A limited number of campers are accepted on a "half-season basis" or for a period of 3-1/2 weeks. First Half - June 30 - July 24. Second Half - July 24 - August 17.

TUITION

Tuition not only covers room, board, program and staff instruction, but also postage, laundry, bedding, stationery, toiletry articles, camp pictures, address book, special transportation for out-of-camp trips, candy, horseback riding, and health center care in camp.

TUTORING

Tutoring may be obtained in most subjects and is scheduled, whenever possible, not to interfere with the camper's regular routine. Two options are available: (1) two hours per week, or (2) three hours per week, at a rate of \$40.00 per hour. Tutoring is payable in advance.

TRAVEL

If numbers permit, chaperons from Winona and Wyonegonic will escort campers from Darien, Connecticut; Boston's Logan Airport, and the Portland (Maine) Jetport via chartered buses or vans. International campers are met the day before each session begins, lodged overnight at an airport hotel, and travel to camp the following day in our chartered buses. Campers are also chaperoned on their return trip to Darien, CT, and are placed on their flights home at Boston's Logan Airport, and the Portland (Maine) Jetport by camp chaperons.

VISITING

The camp is closed to visitors from June 30 through and including July 9, (for second half campers, please do not visit prior to August 3. This allows campers a reasonable time to adjust to the camp routine. The camp is also closed to visitors from August 14 until Awards Night, 7:00 PM, August 16 to allow the boys to fully enjoy the end of season activities.

Parents are cordially invited to visit between July 10 and August 13 (second half, see note above) and are welcome to join us for our Saturday night cookouts. Those wishing to take their own children out for a meal may make arrangements with the Winona Office.

SPRING DETAILS

Pre-camp Information is mailed to parents of enrolled campers monthly from February - June, including our *Parents' Guide*, transportation information and trunk shipping labels. More details regarding Winona's policies and procedures can be found at our website: www.winonacamps.com.

CAMP OUTFIT

There is a minimum required camp outfit of regulation shorts and shirts for all campers.

The Amerasport Company, Holliston, MA, <www.Amerasport.com> makes a specialty of outfitting boys' and girls' camps, and our outfit is purchased through them. Order and measurement blanks with price list will be sent in due time after a camper is enrolled. Orders should be placed as early as possible to ensure delivery of articles at home before camp opens.

ALL CLOTHING AND ALL OTHER ARTICLES SHOULD BE PLAINLY MARKED WITH CAMPER'S NAME IN FULL. SEWED-ON NAME TAPES FOR CLOTHING ARE RECOMMENDED.

Trunks

Trunks are recommended in order to store clothing at camp. Where possible we will ship campers' trunks home by United Parcel Service. UPS can handle only those trunks which weigh less than 150 pounds and measure less than 130 inches (girth plus length). The trunks sold by Amerasport meet these specifications.

UNIT ASSIGNMENT

Each unit offers its own facilities and programs suited to the age and ability of its campers. A unit director, head counselor, tent and activity staff are retained specifically for each group. Sometimes final unit assignments for campers will not be made until after April 1st. This allows us to accept a full enrollment and to assure that your son will be with boys within his own age group.
