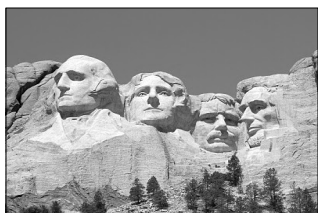


Tribal Competitions
